

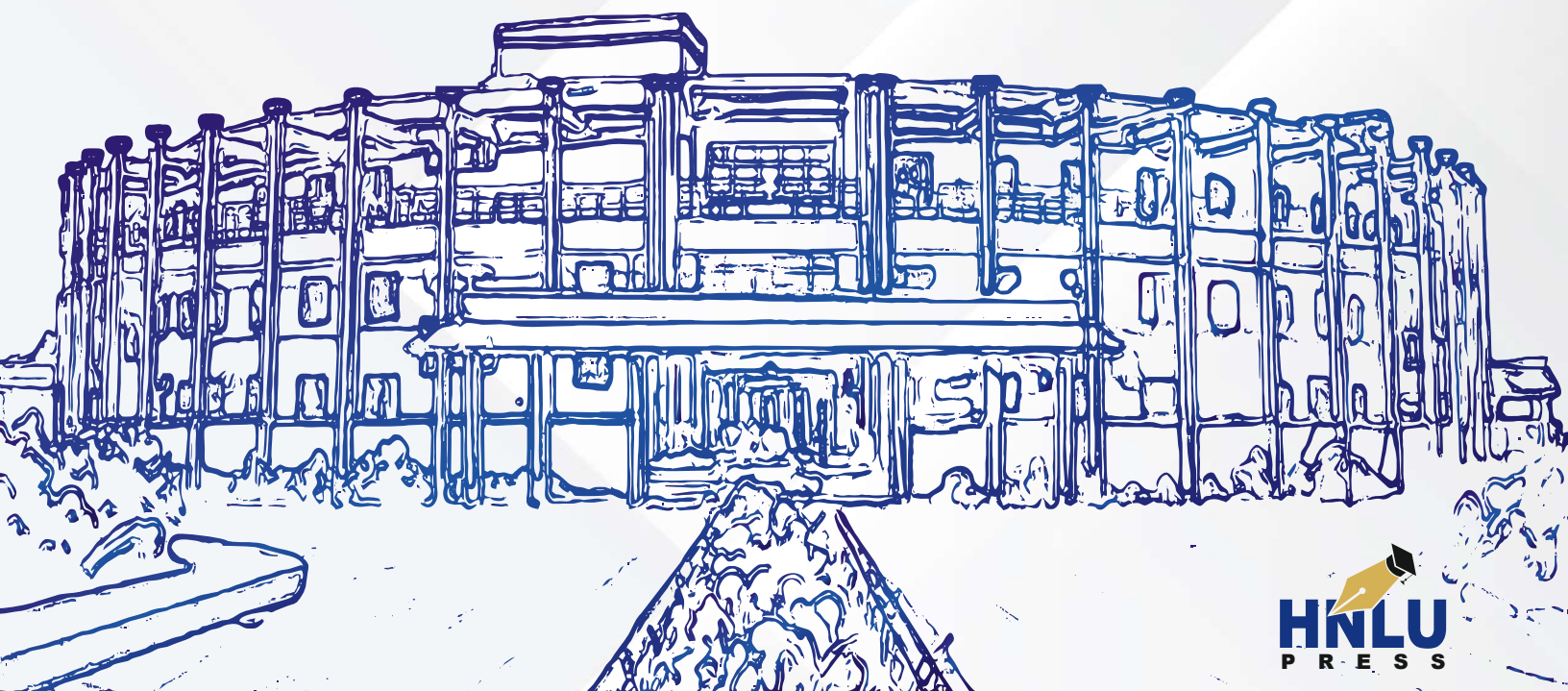

Hidayatullah, was established in 2003 by the Government of Chhattisgarh under the Hidayatullah National University of Law, Chhattisgarh Act (No. 10 of 2003). Nestled in the lush green surroundings of the meticulously planned city of Nava Raipur, HNLU stands as one of the premier destinations for legal education in the country, attracting students from all across India. The University boasts state-of-the-art academic and residential facilities for its students, faculty, and staff.

Embodying its motto, '***Dharma Sansthapanartham,***' which translates to '***for the sake of establishing the primacy of the laws of eternal values,***' HNLU is committed to imparting quality legal education. It actively engages in teaching and research and aims to foster in its students a deep sense of responsibility to serve society in the realm of law, emphasizing advocacy and legal reforms.

HNLU is the sixth in the series of National Law Schools across India. The University is on the list maintained by the University Grants Commission under Section 2(f) of the UGC Act, 1956, and has been deemed eligible to receive Central assistance as per the rules outlined in Section 12 (B) of the UGC Act, 1956. Further, the university is recognized by the Bar Council of India under Section 7 of the Advocates Act, 1961. Rules of Promotion for B.A. LL.B. (Hons.)

- There shall be no automatic promotion to the students.
- The students are required to obtain 1 GPA to pass their semester examination.
- The students will be promoted to second year even if they have not secured the minimum CGPA in the 1st year but they will not be promoted to fifth semester unless they have secured minimum 1 Grade Point in every subject of first and second semesters as well as cumulatively.
- The students will be admitted to the ninth semester only if they secure 1 Grade Point in their subjects of first, second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth semesters as well as cumulatively.
- If the students fail to secure 1 CGPA even after appearing two times (one initially & second repeat), they will be treated as year back students.

1. 5% seats shall be reserved horizontally for Specially Abled Persons (SAP) at the All India level according to The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.
2. 5% seats shall be reserved horizontally for the Specially Abled Persons (SAP) and 3% Seats shall be reserved horizontally for the Dependents of Freedom Fighters (DFF) category of candidates belonging to the State of Chhattisgarh only.



3. If a Chhattisgarh domicile candidate qualifies for admission in the regular merit under the All-India category, he/she shall be considered against the All-India seat only and not against Chhattisgarh domicile seats.
4. 30% of seats shall be reserved horizontally for female candidates across all categories of seats.
5. The allotment of seats to various CG Domicile category candidates will be made as per the Guidelines issued by the Government of Chhattisgarh from time to time.

However, the candidates seeking admission under the NRI category and Supernumerary seats for the Wards of Kashmiri Migrants & Students from Jammu & Kashmir will have to apply for and appear in CLAT-2027 under the respective categories.

After the Publication of CLAT-2027 Result, the interested and eligible candidates applied for and appeared in CLAT-2027 under the NRI and Supernumerary seats for the Wards of Kashmiri Migrants and Students from Jammu & Kashmir will be required to apply to HNLU in the prescribed format to be posted on the university website with their CLAT Score/Rank and other required information and documents.

LIVING & DINING @ HNLU

The University also has spacious Halls of Residences spread across the campus with boys and girls wings. The Boys Hostel cluster called **KAILASH** is named after the beautiful caves of Chhattisgarh and the Girls hostel cluster named **VITASTA** named after the beautiful River Jhelum. Both the Boys and



Girls hostel have a total of 629 rooms each spread across 4 separate sub-hostel wings.

The hostel rooms are fully furnished with a Cot, Table, Chair, and Almirah and every room also have a separately attached balcony. Every wing of the hostel has its own dedicated State-of-the-art Kitchen and Air-Conditioned Dining Hall. Each hostel wing has a well-built and advanced gymnasium complex and a common room with pre-installed cable TV for recreational activities. The hostels do have a night canteen catering late nights.

Each hostel wing and dining area is equipped with water coolers. The washrooms are equipped with Solar powered Hot Water facilities and the University also has plans to establish a centralized RO Plant in the coming academic year.

The infrastructure of the library is a three-story building with a seating capacity of over 600 students provides ample space for individuals to study and engage in research. Moreover, the fully air-conditioned and comfortable environment contributes to a pleasant reading experience.

The library's online learning platforms and interfaces, such as Taxman, Legit quest,

These platforms likely offer a wealth of legal and scholarly resources, allowing students to access a vast array of information and conduct research efficiently. The resources of the Learning Resources are also made accessible to the students through RemoteXs.

The inclusion of environment-friendly spacious lounges in the library at HNLU showcases a thoughtful approach to creating a conducive and sustainable environment for students. The design of these lounges, located just below an open-to-sky area protected by a transparent polycarbonate roof, allows for natural light to illuminate the space throughout the day.



CITY SHUTTLES



The University provides two shuttle buses, each with a seating capacity of 50, that run every evening from the campus to the city center. These shuttles cater to students' and faculty's needs for shopping, dining, and entertainment. Conveniently, a city corporation bus stop is situated just 1 km away from the University, with buses operating at frequent intervals of 15-20 minutes. Additionally, the Swami Vivekananda Airport is a mere 15-minute drive from the campus, while the Raipur railway station lies 35 km away, ensuring ease of travel for those coming to or departing from the University.

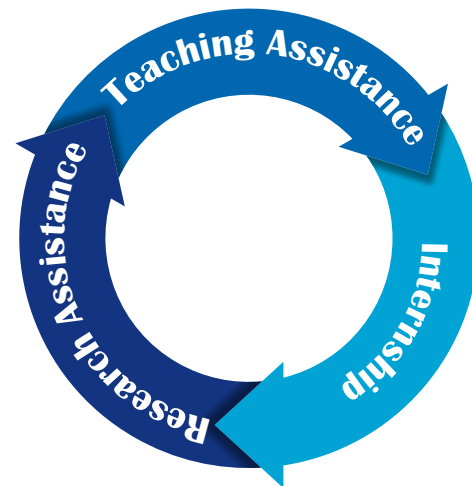
Vice-Chancellor's Means-Cum-Merit Scholarship Scheme (VC-M²S²)

The Hidayatullah National Law University, Raipur has launched the Vice Chancellor's Means cum Merit Scholarship Scheme. The Scheme aims to provide financial assistance to economically disadvantaged but meritorious students of

UG & PG courses of the University. The scheme will provide scholarship to the tune of 50 % of the annual fees to a total of 24 students of II to V Year of B.A., LL.B. (Hons) and 6 students of LL.M. every year for the second semester.

HNLU Academic Assistance and Internship Programme (HAAI)

HNLU launched the Hidayatullah Exchange Academy Programme (HEXA) in August 2022. Through HEXA, HNLU intends to collaborate with leading international and

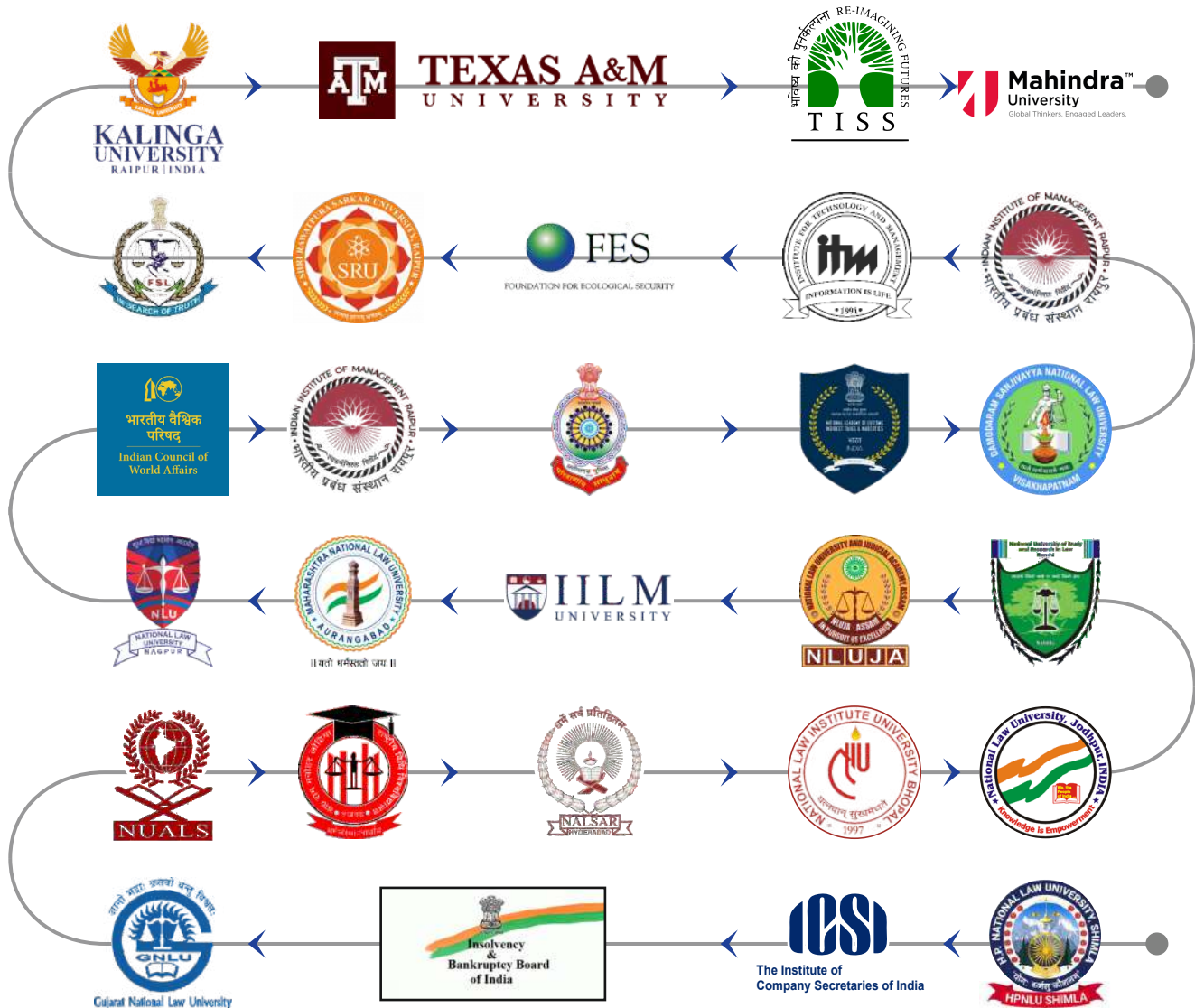
national universities for a diverse range of academic activities like International Lecture Series, Student and Faculty Exchange programme, conducting of conferences, workshops, and seminars.

The H-VISA Programme is curated to facilitate academic scholars from leading Universities in the world to visit for teaching and research at HNLU. The H-VISA Jurists will be facilitated with campus accommodation, research cabins, secretarial assistance,

research scholar assistance and other infrastructure. The H-VISA Programme will also sponsor International travel and suitable remuneration for their services during their engagement at HNLU.



HNLU HEALTH SHIELD

Medical Centre

HNLU has a Medical Centre with improved facilities. Having two doctors, a male and a female, available on a daily basis for consultation ensures that students and staff have access to medical care conveniently. The presence of an in-residence nurse further enhances the

healthcare services provided on campus. The clinic's location in the Utility Centre makes it easily accessible for everyone within the university community. Additionally, having essential pharmaceutical stocks ensures that basic medications are readily available when needed.

Ambulances

This year the University has also procured State-of-the-art Ambulances that are equipped with advanced medical equipment and technology, allowing for effective emergency response and transportation of

patients. These ambulances are designed to provide a safe and comfortable environment for patients during transit, while also enabling medical professionals to deliver immediate care and support.

Counselling

HNLU places a strong emphasis on mental health support for its students and staff. Accordingly, it has provision of both online and offline psychological counseling services.

On-campus Counselling Facility

The availability of a counselor on campus for offline meetings provides an opportunity for individuals to seek face-to-face support and guidance. This can be particularly beneficial for those who prefer in-person interactions or require more personalized assistance.

24x7 Online Counselling Facility

HNLU's collaboration with YourDost, an online counseling platform, further expands the avenues for mental health support. Online consultations offer convenience & accessibility to individuals who may prefer or require remote counseling sessions thereby allowing students to connect with qualified professionals virtually.

Comprehensive Health Insurance Policy

Hidayatullah National Law University is the first amongst Nation Law Universities to implement an insurance scheme for its undergraduate and postgraduate students as part of its comprehensive Campus Health Initiative (CHI). The University has contracted with National Insurance Company (NIC). The Insurance Policy covers every student at the University. National Insurance Company which will provide a cover of Rs. 1,00,000/- for individual students. This covers cashless services in hospitals with consultation fee and

diagnostic test as per the CGHS rates. There is also a provision for additional buffer of Rs. 1 Lakh should be there for students, who may require above and over Rs. 1 Lakh as per medical exigencies and based on the instruction of the University. Cashless admission and treatment are to be provided throughout the country in your approved hospital/nursing home in every case with membership number/insurance card issued by the TPA. This will be mitigating the hardship of the student on emergency cash for treatment. The policy covers all diseases including Covid19 and its variants.



BEYOND CLASSROOMS

Legal Aid & Pro-Bono @ HNLU

Legal Aid plays an important role in the legal profession and HNLU through its Legal and Social Services Committee strives to ensure justice by furthering the right to be heard and enlightening the students about the practicality of the functions of the complex government machinery. The Legal and Social Services Committee, which is established as a part of the Bar Council of India's mandate with every institution imparting legal education, is formed to spread awareness on precipitating legal issues faced by the communities at large and also to provide avenues for underprivileged members of the society to resolve their legal issues on a pro-bono basis. The Legal and Social Service Committee which was established with this fundamental objective in mind played a crucial role during the pandemic and moved beyond its statutory mandate. Additionally, Pro-Bono Club has been established under the aegis of Nyaya Bandhu in the University.

R-HaS

The University has restructured and redesigned its research efforts in tune with the contemporary priorities with its novel model christened as “**R- HaS**” {Research- Hub and Spoke}. The **R- HaS** constitutes Five Hubs structured as School of Law & Technology, School of Law & Public Policy, School of Law & Humanities, School of Law and Business, School of Law and Governance, Each School to have five centres of research.

event will go international rechristened as “Hidayatullah Memorial International Moot Court Competition (HIMCC) with the participation of international teams with a budget outlay of Rs One Crore.

Financing Mooting

With the financial assistance received from the Government of Chhattisgarh, the university spends Rs. One crore every year for the participation of students in moot court competitions, seminars, conferences,

and workshops at the national and international levels. Our students, on multiple occasions, have brought laurels to the University by showing steely talent in various prestigious moot court competitions.

Cultural Life

The University is a diverse space for students across the country to live, study and learn. There are students from every state and union territory imparting the unity in diversity spirit. The student initiative of **Colossus** is a three-day festival of culture
