The National Law University Odisha (NLUO) has made a mark for itself in the field of legal education. It was established by Act 4 of 2008 and started its academic activities in 2009. In a span of fourteen years, the University has made a name for itself by earning laurels with excellent performance of its students in various moot courts, literary debating competitions & other co-curricular activities. Our faculty research output has always been of a very high standard. Faculty publications in several top-tier international publications bespeak their subject expertise and scholarship. The student community's engagement with co-curricular activities has yielded remarkable results, including consistent high performance in moot court competitions and active participation in prestigious national and international conferences and seminars. Our rigorous academic discipline, coupled with a friendly learning environment, provides a platform for the students to realize their true potential and develop in their fields of interest and passion.



The University has received recognition from the University Grants Commission (UGC) under Section 12(b) of the UGC Act 1956 and has been receiving grants under the 12th Plan. The University's degrees are duly recognized by the Bar Council of India. It is also an associate member of the UGC-INFLIBNET, and a participant in the National Knowledge Network under the Ministry of Information Technology and Communication, Government of India. National Law University Odisha is ISO 9001:2015 certified and NAAC accredited. National Law University Odisha, Cuttack (NLU Odisha) has witnessed a significant increase in its position on the annual rankings over the last year. As per the annual India Today Report on Best Law Colleges in India, National Law University Odisha was ranked 7th amongst various law colleges and universities across India. As per the National Institutional Ranking Framework, NLUO was ranked at 26th amongst various established universities across India. NLUO has its own campus spread over 50 acres near Naraj at the western extreme of the historical city of Cuttack. The area is known for its scenic beauty. NLUO's 1st ISO Surveillance Audit was conducted by the Bureau of Indian Standards on 15th and 16th July 2024. A



certificate with observation confirming Quality Management System of the University as per standard IS/ISO 9001:2015 has been issued by the Bureau of Indian Standards.

The teachers at NLUO are mostly alumni of the leading National Law Universities in India and reputed law schools abroad. They come from diverse backgrounds, having served in the office of the Chief Justice of India, practiced in law at the Bar, served in civil society organisations, served in the Indian Police Service, and have headed various reputed educational institutions in the past. 4. We provide state-of-the-art infrastructure like a fully equipped library, 24 x 7 Wi-Fi enabled campus, audio-visual enabled classrooms and moot court hall, Seminar-cum-Convention Hall, Amphitheatre, Conference Hall, Gymnasium, Sports Complex, Cricket & Football Ground, Hostel & Mess facilities, etc. to facilitate a smooth and enjoyable learning process.

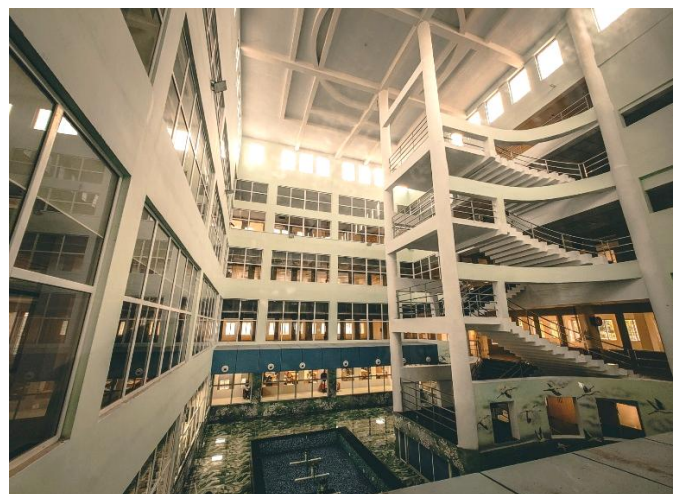


5. To fulfill our social commitment, we organize legal aid camps in the villages across the State of Odisha in collaboration with the United Nations Development Program, the High Court of Orissa, and the District Judiciary. These programs are organized, and coordinated entirely by the student body under the supervision of law professors. This enables the students to learn the application of law in society and connect it with the principles of law taught in the classroom.



6. To multiply the effect of legal scholarship, we frequently organize lecture series/ seminars/ conferences/ workshops on diverse aspects of law and allied subjects by inviting scholars, practitioners, lawyers, judges, and members of the media who share their critical perspectives and experiences in the fields of law, politics, judiciary, economic affairs, international affairs, history, and culture. This provides a platform for open dialogue between scholars, faculty, and students and generates a healthy environment of cross-sectoral learning.

7. NLUO provides an excellent opportunity for students to hone their mooting skills, which include drafting memoranda and presenting arguments. Students are also well supported to travel nationally and internationally to represent the university in prestigious moot court competitions. The University has its own state-of-art moot courtroom facility.



8. To keep a close check on our quality standards, we conduct periodic revisions of academic curriculum, course syllabus, teaching pedagogy, and learning skills to meet the changing needs of legal education based on the student feedback, peer review process, and professional and industrial inputs.



Research and Innovations

Research and innovation are the bedrock of any progressive institution. NLUO has adopted this principle since its establishment. In pursuit of this commitment, we have invested in the establishment of research centres to develop legal scholarship in the selected branches of law. Human Rights Fund of Netherlands and United Nations organisations like UNDP and UNICEF have been actively supporting our research endeavours. University's Centre for Child Rights (CCR), in collaboration with UNICEF, is a testimony to this partnership. In addition, NLUO is also receiving funding from institutions viz: Insolvency and Bankruptcy Board of India and IIPI for conducting research in commercial laws. Community Outreach Programs



NLUO believes in serving the community and thus has launched various outreach programs while functioning through various government schemes. Conversion Policy (upon Vacant Seats during the Admission Process)

If no candidate is available against the Seats reserved for Resident Students of Odisha, such Seats shall be added to the relevant Categories under the All India Quota.

The unfilled Seats reserved for SEBC candidates shall be assigned to Odisha General candidates. If sufficient eligible Odisha General candidates are not available to fill such Seats, the seats shall be assigned to All India General Category candidates in order of CLAT merit.
