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ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

The West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences (NUJS), Kolkata, is one of India's premier National Law Universities. Established under the West Bengal National University of Juridical Sciences Act, 1999 (West Bengal Act IX of 1999), the University was founded to advance and disseminate learning and knowledge of law and legal processes and their role in national development. NUJS received formal recognition under a specific provision of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956, in August 2004, and was granted permanent affiliation by the Bar Council of India in July 2005. The Chief Justice of India serves as the Chancellor of NUJS, Hon'ble Mr. Justice Surya Kant, and the University is currently led by Vice-Chancellor Prof. (Dr.) Omprakash Nandimath V.

Over the years, NUJS has garnered national acclaim for its holistic and rigorous academic environment that nurtures excellence across legal education and beyond. The University has built a distinguished legacy of producing accomplished legal professionals who have gained valuable experience across all levels of the Indian judiciary, from trial courts to the Supreme Court. Its alumni have also secured placements at top-tier law firms, corporations, and organisations, both in India and abroad. NUJS graduates have consistently excelled in securing prestigious scholarships such as the Rhodes, Felix, Inlaks, Commonwealth, and Chevening, and have pursued advanced degrees at leading global institutions. They have achieved remarkable success in national and international moot court competitions, debates, literary contests, and sporting events. Beyond traditional legal roles, NUJS students contribute meaningfully to society as civil servants, policy-makers, academics, and entrepreneurs. Many of them are at the helm of pioneering legal start-ups in India. The University's commitment to academic excellence is further enriched by the regular involvement of eminent judges, lawyers, academics, and public administrators who serve as visiting faculty and mentors.

WBNUJS is recognized under Sections 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956. The National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) awarded it an 'A+' grade, and it is ranked 4th in the NIRF India Ranking 2025 under the Law Category.



FACULTY

WBNUJS has an excellent faculty with a good mix of young and experienced scholars. The faculty includes Fulbright, Commonwealth and Chevening scholars and alumni from prestigious Universities from all across the world. Faculty members have published in numerous prestigious international and national law journals and have been widely acclaimed for their contributions towards social and legal causes.

WBNUJS has been enriched by the wisdom of several luminaries from the world of law and public policy, some of whom have also been associated as Adjunct or Visiting Faculty and Chair Professors.

LIBRARY

The University Central Library occupies a central location commanding a spectacular view of the quadrangle and hostels. The Reading Room is spread over 758 sq. metres of floor space providing 400 seats.

As an integral component of the academic programs, the library supports the University's teaching and research. The library is much more than a repository for the accumulated knowledge in law and social sciences, it serves as the heart of our intellectual enterprise.

As of 2026 the library has purchased over 27000 books, We have over the years received private individual collections of eminent legal luminaries and professors amounting to over 4000 title. The journal archive has an impressive collection of over 8000 volumes of bound journals. The Library archives holds the complete sets of Fleet Street Report, Public Law, Anti-Trust Law Journal, All England Law Reports from 1558 and AIR from 1920 onwards.

Keeping in mind the need to provide accessibility to resources at all times the library provides remote access to all bona-fide users and extensively subscribes to 30 online legal databases – both national and international. These may be viewed in <https://library.nujs.edu/nujs-on-line-resources/>

We also subscribe to 10 daily newspapers to ensure students are abreast of the news and to assist them in preparation for UPSC, and other competitive examinations.

NUJS is also a member of the Government of India approved 'One Nation One Subscription' scheme to provide country-wide access to international high impact scholarly research articles and journal publications to students, faculty and researchers of all Higher Education Institutions managed by the central government and state governments and Research & Development Institutions of the central government. Within this we have access to 30 online databases in the fields of science, medicine, social sciences and technology The library timings as a norm is from 6 am to 2 am on all days. During co-curricular activities, project submission, end-semester examinations and recruitment the library operates 24/7.

Facilities available within the library are photocopying, printing, computers, scanning. Regular newsletters are sent to faculty and users - New Book Addition, Newspaper Clippings, Curated list of latest cases laws, legal developments and amendments. Regular training sessions both online and offline are organised to address students queries and to make them proficient in the use of databases.

The library places equal emphasis on the provision of quality services for its users. Experienced staff are there to assist you in using the collection and online services. From its humble initiatives on 1 June 2000 there has been a rapid and significant growth in the collection. Our library collection is accessed on request by academicians, students, professors from all over India and abroad. Many of whom come from much older institutions with libraries over 100-150 years old.

ADMISSIONS

Admission to the 5 – year B.A LL.B (Hons)/ B.Sc LL.B (Hons) program and a 1–year LL.M program are through the Common Law Admission Test (CLAT) administered by the Consortium of NLUs.

The B.A LL.B (Hons) program has a total intake of **120 seats**, with 70 seats for All India candidates, 20 seats for NRI/ NRI Sponsored category and 30 seats for Resident students of West Bengal, The total intake includes seats for SC, ST, OBC (A & B category), persons with benchmark disabilities and NRI/ NRI sponsored.

The B.Sc LL.B (Hons) programme has a total intake of **60 seats**, 32 seats for All India candidates, 10 seats NRI/ NRI Sponsored category and 18 seats for Resident students of West Bengal. The total intake includes seats for SC, ST, OBC (A & B category), persons with benchmark disabilities and NRI/ NRI sponsored.

The LL.M programme has a total intake of **100 seats**, with 70 of seats for All India candidates and 30 seats for Resident students of West Bengal. The total intake includes seats for SC, ST, OBC (A & B category), persons with benchmark disabilities and NRI/ NRI sponsored.

ELIGIBILITY For UG Programme

- Candidates who have passed in 10+2 or an equivalent examination with a minimum of:
 - a. Forty-five percent (45%) of marks or equivalent grade
 - b. Forty percent (40%) of marks or equivalent in case of candidates belonging to SC/ST/PwD categories.
- There is no upper age limit for the UG Programme.
- Candidates appearing for the qualifying examination in March/ April 2027 are also eligible to take the Admission Test. However, they shall be required to produce an evidence of their passing the qualifying examination at the time of admission, failing which they shall lose their right to be considered admission.

The eligibility is as per the CLAT–2027 Notification. For details see [CLAT website](#).



For PG Programme

- Candidates who have passed in LL.B or an equivalent examination with a minimum of:
 - a. Fifty percent (50%) of marks or equivalent grade
 - b. Forty-five percent (45%) of marks or equivalent in case of candidates belonging to SC/ST/PwD categories.
- There is no upper age limit for the UG Programme.
- Candidates appearing for the qualifying examination in the year of admission are also eligible to take the Admission Test, but their admission to the course shall be subject to their fulfilling the conditions stipulated in the Regulations and producing supporting documentary evidence at the time of admission.

The eligibility is as per the CLAT–2027 Notification. For details see [CLAT website](#).

WEST BENGAL DOMICILE CATEGORY:

1. Candidates who have studied for not less than ten (10) years in a recognized educational institution in West Bengal as on the last date for receiving applications as declared by the CLAT Notification of 2027 shall be eligible to be considered as 'West Bengal Domicile.'
2. Candidates who do not currently live in West Bengal are still eligible if their parent are permanent residents of West Bengal and have a permanent home address within the state.

NRI/NRI SPONSORED CATEGORY:

1. Admission shall be based on CLAT 2027 Scorecard and All India Rank
2. Admission to be made separately by the University. A separate notification shall be floated on the University website after the publication of CLAT 2027 results. Detailed admission criteria shall be available in the notification.

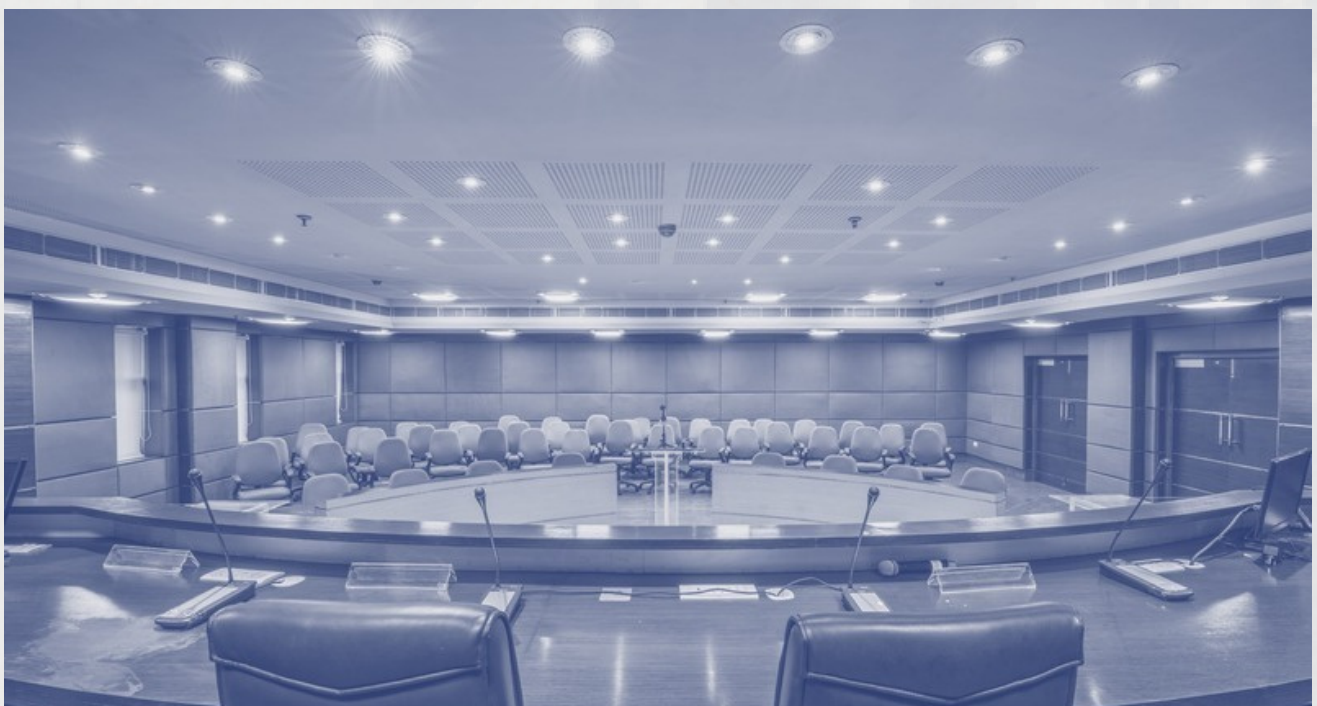

COURSES

B.A LL.B (Hons.) Programme

The B.A. LL.B. (Hons.) is the flagship five-year undergraduate law programme of the University, divided into ten semesters. The curriculum combines law, social sciences, and humanities to provide students with a multidisciplinary understanding of law and its relationship with society and is divided into ten semesters.

Students learn through discussion-based, interactive classroom experience and a rigorous Socratic methodology which encourages critical thinking. The academic year is divided into two semesters of equal duration, followed by an examination at the end of each semester. Every student undergoes rigorous training and skills learning through projects, viva voce, moot court participation, and several other intensive activities.

The programme, has been designed in a manner that allows integration of law, social sciences and humanities. This seeks to provide our students with a holistic appreciation of law and its interaction with the society from a multi-disciplinary perspective. Therefore, the programme requires students to complete courses on History, Political Science, Economics, and Sociology along with law-courses.

Students are motivated to develop strong research and legal writing skills by preparing research papers for assessment and by publishing their work in academic law journals.

B.Sc LL.B (Hons.) Programme

B.Sc LL.B (Hons) Criminology and Forensic Science is an integrated course that combines the core subjects of law and forensic science. The course provides a perfect combination for students seeking careers in the field of law enforcement. The integrated knowledge of the students will be helpful to the criminal justice system as they can handle the legal issues with scientific aptitude. B.Sc LL.B (Hons) Criminology and Forensic Science graduates will become the torchbearers of empirical legal practices in India.

Additionally, it has significant edge over the similar undergraduate level courses i.e B.Sc Forensic Science and B. Sc LL.B, as both of these courses do not include all the core subjects of Law and Forensic Science, respectively. The course provided the parallel opportunity to the students to learn the core subjects of Forensic Science as well as Law

LL.M Programme

The Master of Laws (LL.M.) is a one-year postgraduate programme designed for students who aspire to pursue careers in academia, advanced legal research, policy-making, or specialised legal practice. The programme attracts learners from diverse academic and professional backgrounds, fostering a dynamic intellectual environment enriched by varied legal interests and career aspirations.

At NUJS, students are mentored by an accomplished faculty renowned for their academic excellence and research expertise. Through close faculty engagement, personalised guidance, and a collaborative learning environment, students are encouraged to realise their full academic potential. The University also values student participation in the continuous enhancement of the programme, ensuring that the LL.M. experience remains intellectually stimulating, academically rigorous, and professionally rewarding.

The curriculum is structured in accordance with the University Grants Commission (UGC) Guidelines for the One-Year LL.M. Degree Programme, 2012. The programme is completed over two semesters of eighteen weeks each and comprises a balanced combination of compulsory and elective courses, complemented by an independent research dissertation. Designed with a strong interdisciplinary orientation, the curriculum situates the study of law within its broader social, political, and economic contexts. Students have the opportunity to explore a wide range of specialised elective courses, including Advanced Jurisprudence, Competition Law, Law and Global Justice, Gender and Law, Criminology, and other contemporary areas of legal scholarship.

Research and academic writing form the cornerstone of the LL.M. programme. Students undertake a substantial research dissertation alongside research papers in every course, enabling them to develop advanced analytical, critical thinking, and legal writing skills. This emphasis on rigorous scholarship equips graduates with the expertise required for doctoral studies, academic careers, policy research, and leadership roles within the legal profession.

The LL.M. programme at NUJS offers an intellectually vibrant academic environment that combines doctrinal excellence, interdisciplinary inquiry, and research-led learning. Graduates emerge with a deeper understanding of law, enhanced research capabilities, and the confidence to contribute meaningfully to legal scholarship, public policy, and professional practice at both national and international levels.
